Comfort Centre

Providing a space to gather, exchange information, and build community connections during power outages, natural disasters, or extreme weather events.

What is a Comfort Centre?

A Comfort Centre is a designated community space that provides essential services and support during emergencies, particularly power outages, natural disasters, or extreme weather events. It's not a full emergency shelter (where people stay overnight), but it offers a safe place where residents can:

- Warm up or cool down
- Access basic first aid and AED
- Washrooms
- Receive information and updates
- Use emergency power or internet access
- Charge devices
- Have light refreshments and social support

Backup Generator

Thanks to community volunteers and a generous grant from Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage (CCTH) in March of 2024, we finished the installation of an automatic propane-powered generator to power the Hall in times of crisis.



We offer free high-speed Wi-Fi access via our Xplore fibre connection, ensuring residents can stay informed and connected when it matters most.

Did you know...

COMFORT CENTRE UPDATE AT LOWER GRANVILLE HALL

We're proud to share that our Hall has been awarded an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) thanks to a generous grant from the Canadian Red Cross and Giant Tiger.

This life-saving device will be installed outside the building in its own alarmed, weather-resistant box, allowing 24/7 public access in the event of an emergency. It will also be registered on the EHS AED registry map, ensuring first responders and the public know it's available.

Question	Answer
When does the Comfort Centre open?	Open during declared emergencies or when local needs arise (extended power outages or weather events), & is open by announcement on Facebook, Hall parking lot event sign, & via Annapolis County media outlets.
Who can use the Comfort Centre?	Anyone in the local community or surrounding area affected by the emergency can access it — no registration required.
